VALUES & PRINCIPLES

Aboriginal Leadership and Self Determination. CA AHSN values building the capabilities of Aboriginal organisations, researchers and staff to have a central role in determining the research, leading the research and using the research.

Aboriginal workforce capabilities. CA AHSN is committed to growing and supporting Aboriginal organisations and individuals in active participation in all aspects of research.

Strengthening Primary Health Care. Committed to the broader cultural, social and environmental aspects of primary health care to support comprehensive improvements in health outcomes

Working Two-Way. CA AHSN is committed to privileging Aboriginal knowledge systems and ways of working to ensure sharing skills, knowledge and understandings between non-Aboriginal and Aboriginal partners is valued and equitable.

Aboriginal Cultural Competence. Is embedded in the way we work.

Research is Community and Health Service driven. Needs and concerns are raised by communities and services who lead the research approach with partnering research institutes.

Use a strengths-based approach. A Strengths focus, in how research is designed, implemented, analysed and translated.

Aboriginal Data Sovereignty. Research Data Governance is at the forefront of designing, undertaking, disseminating and translating research to ensure Aboriginal control in how data is used, stored and shared. This is informed by Human Research Ethics Guidelines, privacy and confidentiality legislation.
